NGAP: Background

- Since 2008, several reports have forecasted a shortage of aviation professionals.
 - Airbus, Boeing and IATA, among others, concur with predictions of this impending shortage, especially in the areas of pilots, air traffic controllers, aircraft maintenance engineers, as reported in ICAO Doc 9956 in 2011.
- In May 2009, ICAO created the NGAP Task Force.
 - This resulted from a round-table discussion with industry, regulators, educators, and international organizations.

NGAP Task Force is a forum to discuss issues and establish collaboration to support activities to prepare for and engage the next generation.

 A global aviation community that has sufficient competent human resources to support a safe, secure and sustainable air transportation system.


NGAP Mission











New Pilots by Region 2015-2034

The Next Generation of Aviation Professional Outreach Campaign Takes Flight with Around the World Outreach

Shaesta Waiz of Dreams Soar organization is inspiring women worldwide to pursue STEM education through aviation. Shaesta, the first civilian female pilot from Afghanistan, will team up with inspiring women from around the world and together, they will host outreach events at most of the stops along the route. Her solo flight, in her Beechcraft Bonanza is scheduled to launch June 2, 2016 from Daytona Beach, Florida and will include approximately 33 stops in 5 continents. Dreams Soar debuted the Beechcraft Bonanza aircraft (N364ER) on January 28, at the upcoming NBAA Regional Forum in West Palm Beach, FL. 

NGAP Today

- Objective to support outreach for attracting youth by promoting career opportunities, from elementary school to university, into aviation education and professions, at global, regional and national levels – e.g. STEM
- Resourced by volunteers from partner Int. Orgs, States, service providers, industry, academia, and training institutions no dedicated ICAO staff nor budget allotted
- Currently managed by ANB expanding to all ICAO Strategic Objectives and involving ROs
- 2 working groups Implementation and Outreach
- Outreach WG has 7 sub-groups Communications and Promotions, Best Practices, Education Outreach and Tertiary Education Directory, Internships and Careers, Montreal Outreach and Civil Aviation Week Preparations, Resource Mobilization, and Research





NGAP Work Plan (2016 – 2017)

- Annual meeting with NGAP community
- Quarterly telcons with partners (10 Int. Orgs. Committed by formal letter to SG)
- Implementation Workshops for roll-out of ATCO and ATSEP CBT provisions (remaining deliverable planned by previous NGAP Task Force) – 2016 - 2017
- Outreach communication media/products including the NGAP web site; NGAP Newsletter; NGAP article in ICAO Training Report; collaboration with Halldale Media for Student Education and Careers in Aviation (SECA) activities at regional aviation training events in North America, Asia and Europe; sharing of NGAP best practices; awareness events continuous
- Book with title "Introduction to International Aviation: Handbook for the Next Generation of Aviation Professionals" being written by NGAP volunteer – 2018
- Planned update of Doc. 9956 by ATB/ED once traffic forecasts have been completed 2017
- Planned development of Index by ATB/ED for forecasting national HR needs 2017





NGAP Tomorrow

- Unite aviation, education and labour sectors at national levels
- Regions to drive their own outreach activities, coordinated by the ICAO Regional Offices, with participation of all partners, supported by the NGAP Programme
- Update HR forecasts and develop HR planning tool
- Examine future changes in aviation human resources
- Develop future aviation HR strategies and roadmap/actions plans
- Consider mechanisms that will allow for greater mobility of Qualified Technical Personnel (QTP) – i.e. formalize cross border acceptance/recognition of qualifications/ certification
